USE DISCRETION WHEN CALLING THE POLICE

For many, calling the police is a natural response to an actual or perceived emergency. However, police do not have sufficient de-escalation training and may become violent during peaceful interactions, especially with our Black, Brown, trans, and gender expansive siblings. This often puts the folks in need of support or nearby helpers at risk of violence perpetrated by the police themselves.

Instead of relying on the police, ask: Is this an emergency, or an inconvenience? Could a neighbor or nearby person support me? Could we use a third party, like a professional mediator or a crisis hotline? If police are required to be involved, can I use the non-emergency line or go to a station to file a claim? If I feel, as a last resort, that police need to be dispatched immediately, do I know how their involvement could impact me, nearby helpers, or the person in need of support? And am I willing to act in a way that helps protect vulnerable parties?
